T LEVELS

Please have a look at the following information about T Levels and the letter from the Education Secretary





T Levels are qualifications combining classroom learning, alongside an industry placement and they are designed for young people as an option following GCSEs (post-16).

Some key facts

- They last for 2 years.
- · They are equivalent to three A levels.
- · They attract UCAS points.
- They have been created alongside employers.
- They include an 'Industry placement' of at least 45 days.
- For anyone not quite ready, there is a 1-year transition programme.
- Students will receive a nationally recognised qualification.

Which T Levels are available?

There are already 10 T Level subjects available, with more being added each year.

The current offer includes:

- Building Services Engineering for Construction
- Design, Surveying and Planning for Construction

- Digital Business Services
- Digital Production, Design and Development
- Digital Support Services
- · Education and Childcare
- Health
- · Healthcare Science
- · Onsite Construction
- Science

And by September 2022:

- · Accounting
- Design and Development for Engineering and Manufacturing
- Engineering, Manufacturing, Processing and Control
- Finance
- Maintenance, Installation and Repair for Engineering and Manufacturing
- · Management and Administration
