# Progression and conditions of entry to exams

- Not automatic
- AS pass is A E, but an E is not adequate for coping with the full A Level. Courses cannot be continued into Year 13 if a student finishes Year 12 on an E or lower.
- Minimum 3 subjects
- SHSB will pay for each student's initial examinations at AS and A Level, conditional upon:-
  - Attendance, punctuality, meeting deadlines, conduct
- Predicted grades will be based on AS results
- If your child doesn't get at least 3 D grades, we can offer alternative educational pathways, consisting of AS Levels in new subjects to fill the timetable.
- We can only offer education for two years students cannot remain at sixth form to complete these additional AS Levels.
