

We know that our school serves a diverse community in terms of income, wealth and circumstance. **We ask** every family to consider making a minimum donation of £10 per month. You may prefer to make a 'one off' contribution. Many families will be able to afford a higher level of donation. Goodhub also allows lower regular payments. With your help, if all our parents contribute, we will be able to secure the new minibus before the summer.

There is a simple 'gift aid' capacity to enable the school to claim back from HMRC a significant uplift (if the donor pays income-tax). Higher rate income tax payers can also benefit from an increased tax allowance if the donation is declared on your tax return.

### Why we're raising money

Right now, we need your help to raise funds for a new minibus. Our volunteer Parents Association have kickstarted our fund by granting a £15,000 contribution. Now we need your help to reach the £40,000 target.

Many schools have access to a single minibus, some have two, we need three! Regular sports fixtures, in particular, fielding multiple teams on the same night, generate a substantial transport demand. It doesn't end there; our existing two minibuses are used extensively for many activities and not just sporting events. We regularly use them for science trips, theatre visits, careers events, DofE expeditions, our sponsored walks, and many other extra-curricular activities.

At present, we find ourselves booking 'third party' minibus coaches several times a month and the cost – across a year – would more than offset the depreciation/maintenance/running costs of a third minibus. A further minibus would also help to reduce the cost to parents of some of our trips; saving money when we can use a minibus rather than hire a coach.
