



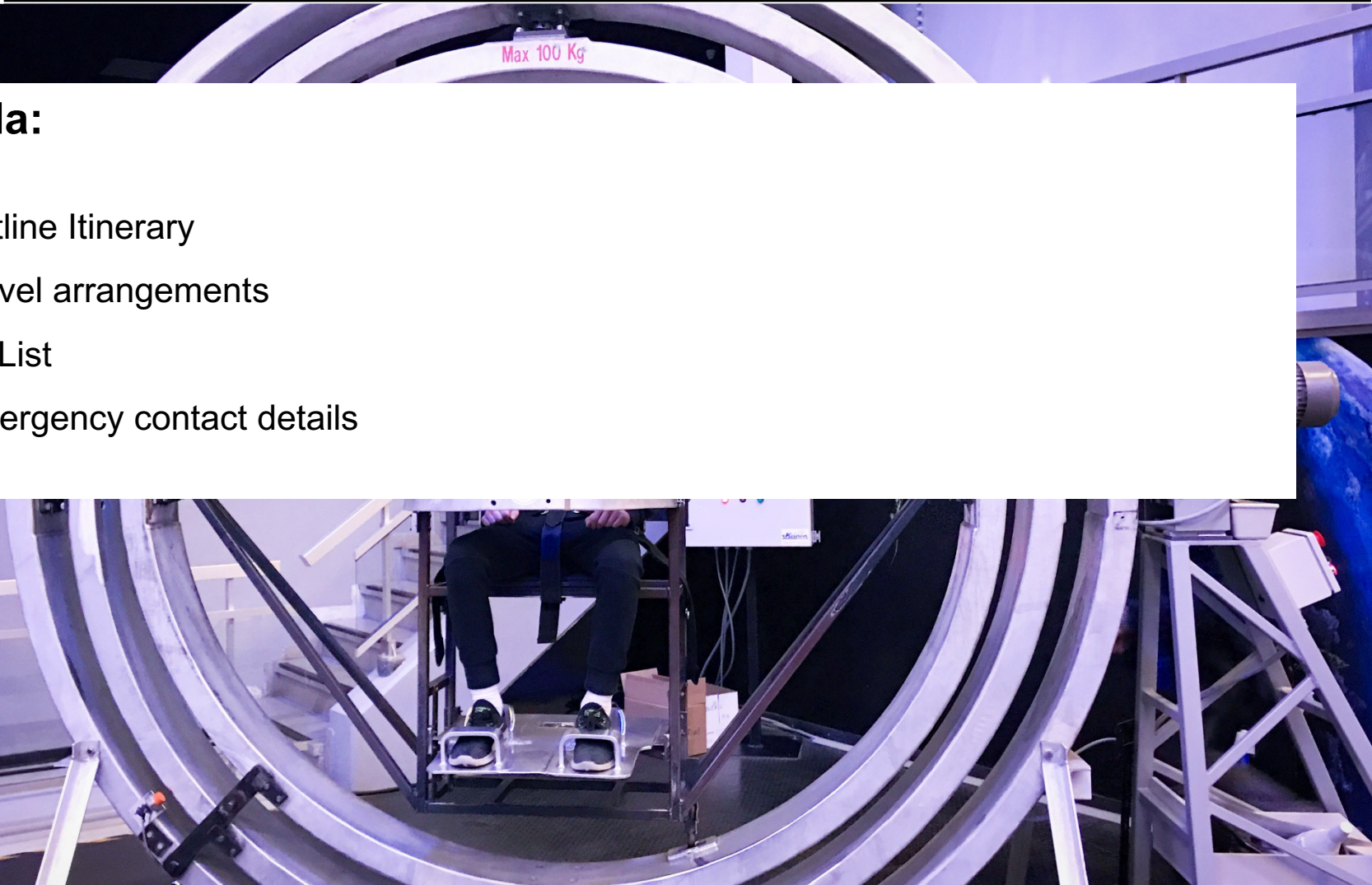

# Day 5

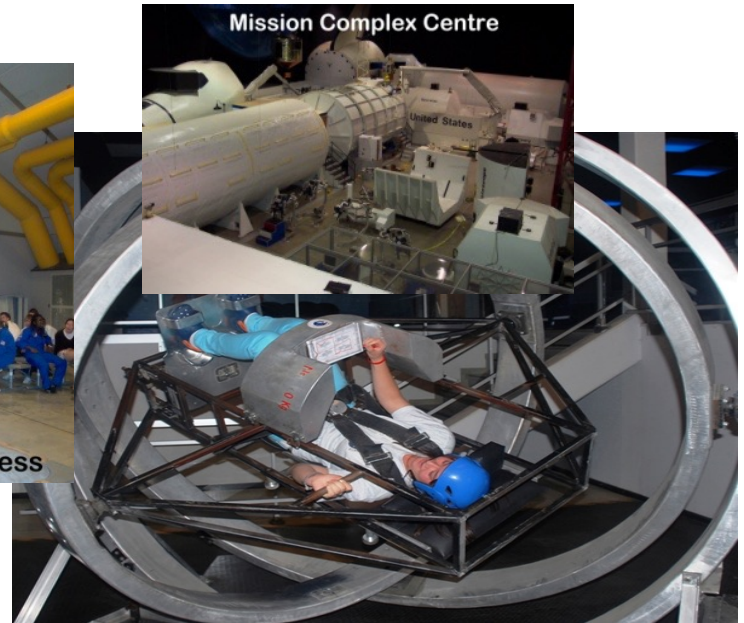
- Zero gravity wall

# Passports & Other Matters

Passports will be held by staff for the duration of the trip apart from when passing through border control.

If you hold a British Passport, it must meet two requirements. It must be:

- less than 10 years old on the day you enter (check the date of issue)
- valid for at least 3 months after the day you plan to leave (check the expiry date)

EHIC and/or GHIC cards are still valid for use within the EU however the school's travel insurance will cover medical treatment.

School insurance will not cover loss of significant personal possessions – e.g. iPads, phones etc. Personal possessions brought on the trip are the sole responsibility of pupils.
