**GCSE EXAMINATIONS – SUMMER 2025 series**

**Results Day**

**GCSE level students** are encouraged to collect their results in school from 8.30 am. As well as enjoying the ambience of such an important day, additional guidance will be available for any student wishing to discuss their results and future plans. Students can collect their results from the Main Hall up to 11.00 am, after which they will be available from the main office.

**GCSE Results Day – 8.30 am Thursday 21st August 2025**

**Students who are unable to collect their own results on Results Day** have two options:

1. A student may nominate another person to collect GCSE results on their behalf. There is a form to be completed and returned to the main office at least 24 hours **before** results day, and the nominee must bring photo ID on the day. The KS4 office and main reception are able to issue the required form and it is available on RM Unify in the Exams Documentation tile.
2. If option 1 is not viable, then students may collect their results online on Go for Schools; hard copy result packs will be available for collection from the main office when manned for the remainder of the holiday period. GCSE results will be available on Go 4 Schools via *student* accounts from 11.00 am on results day (students must set up their accounts in advance and log in; student results will not be visible on parent accounts). Please note that the priority review of marking request deadline is the day after results as well as priority script requests.

**Review of Results and Script Requests**

**All non-priority review of marking queries will be dealt with at the beginning of term.** Students may come to the exams office in the first week back to seek advice from the Exams Officer, Mrs McNish, as well as speaking to their subject teacher about grade/level boundaries and expected performance. The Deadline for non-priority applications is the 19th September.

**Priority review of marking/access to scripts:** If a sixth form/higher education place is at risk, this is classed as a **priority case** and students can speak to the Examinations Officer on Results day or the day after results if advice or priority post results services are required. The GCSE Priority Review of Results/Access to Priority Script deadline is the 22nd August (by 15.00 hrs). Please note that only Pearson have a GCSE priority review of marking service.

For both priority and non-priority requests for post results services, cash or cheque payments are required with each completed form (**NOTE:** online/Wisepay/telephone payments are **not accepted**). Application forms have been emailed, are in results packs and are also outside the exams office.

## Grade Boundaries

On a student's statement of results, issued by the school on Results Day, there will be a break down of the marks awarded for each paper taken per qualification. The total of these (including any weighting applied) make up the final mark and overall grade for each subject.
