

Parental information evening handout

Dover Crossing

- Your son is unlikely to be turned away, however if this happens we will have to ask you to come and collect him as quickly as possible.
- You may be asked to take a teacher back with you, as we can't leave a staff member in Dover with the expectation to make their own way home or to go through France and Belgium by themselves to try and catch up with us.
- Possible reasons for being turned away could be:
 - Having a passport from a country that doesn't have travel agreements with EU (as far as I can tell this doesn't apply to anyone here)
 - Having a passport that expires before May 7th. If your son's passport does expire before May 7th, if you act very fast you may still be able to apply for an expedited passport as this can be applied for and received within a week
 - Losing or forgetting their passport
 - Bringing a prohibited item across the border (weapons, gunpowder, non prescription drugs)

Pickup and drop-off times

- Due to Brexit related knock on effects, the crossings take much longer than they used to, and that has squeezed the itinerary quite a lot as we can do less on each day.
- This means we are back later than we were initially quoted.
- We will meet at SHSB **at 5am on the Friday** to check in at Dover at 7.45 for our crossing at 9.45.
- On the Saturday, **our crossing is at 5.45pm** so we should be **back at SHSB at around 8pm**.
- We will get the boys to let you know where we are as we get closer to the school so you have a more accurate ETA

Spending money

- We recommend about 75 Euros as spending money
- **They should set aside 15 Euros of this for dinner on the return leg of the journey**
- Breakfast is provided on Saturday, as is a packed lunch. Dinner however is not provided, so they will need to buy something on the Ferry, or at the service station at the terminal
- Optional places where pupils may like to buy things are:
 - the family run Belgian chocolate shop we will be visiting on Friday
 - We will be having some free time in the town square of Ypres before the Menin gate on Friday
 - There are gift shops at the museums we will attend on Friday
 - Service stations that the coaches stop off at, however we have no pre scheduled stops it is ad hoc as needed
